











Transforming Learning Spaces

Lutheran High School began in 1982 with only 17 students in two classrooms in a trailer, housed on the grounds of Holy Cross Lutheran Church in O'Fallon.

Over the next several years, enrollment continued to grow, and the school moved several times before prior to building its current facilities on Mexico Road in 1989. Since then, more classrooms and spaces have been added to maintain an exceptional learning environment where students "Grow and Serve in Christ."

The 2017 Reach Up, Reach In, Reach Out Capital Campaign funded a new chemistry lab, a STEM – Science, Technology, Engineering & Math – classroom, a music room, 3 new general-use classrooms, a library/media center, a lecture hall, and a new gym. Now, it's time to finish what we started: With our new major fundraising efforts, we will renovate nine additional classrooms and science labs, which have not been updated since the building was built in 1989. By investing in these renovations, we will create classrooms that reflect the excellence of our Christ-centered education while meeting the evolving needs of our students and teachers.
